


Figure 1 V1022577

#### Engine revolution governor (Heinzmann).

The engine revolution governor on the D4D engine is of the centrifugal type.


Engine type, serial number and rated speed (rpm) must always be stated when ordering a governor as spare part.

Each regulator for the above mentioned engines has been especially made for a particular engine. This means that a governor cannot be moved from one engine to another.

#### NOTE!


An incorrectly adjusted governor may cause the engine not to meat the applicable regulations for emissions and performance.







# **Engine, description**

The engine is a four-cylinder, four-stroke, in-line diesel engine with direct injection, exhaust turbocharger, liquid cooling and internal, unregulated exhaust gas recirculation (EGR).

To comply with exhaust gas limit values, the turbocharger is equipped with **unregulated, internal exhaust gas recirculation (IEGR)**, which returns the exhaust gas within the cylinder head to the combustion air. The oxygen content of this exhaust is low. A lower oxygen content reduces the temperature spike during combustion and thereby reduces nitrogen oxide (NO<sub>x</sub>).

The camshaft has an extra cam - the trailing cam. This causes the inlet valve to briefly open during the exhaust stroke so that exhaust gas also enters the engine intake system. In the subsequent induction stroke, this exhaust is sucked back in. There is no regulation of exhaust gas quantity.

#### **Engine data plate**

The engine data plate specifies model, engine number and power data. The engine number is also stamped into the crankcase. Model and engine number must be specified when ordering spare parts. The direction of rotation is found on the flywheel, anticlockwise. Firing order: 1-3-4-2 (cylinder no. 1 on the flywheel side).

IMPORTANT! Adjustments to the regulator may only be performed by trained staff in an authorized central repair workshop.




Figure 2 Components, servicing view




Figure 3 Components, exhaust view

# **Engine, removal**

#### Op nbr 21070-1

14360000 Vacuum pump Lifting chains, min. 1000 kg (2200 lb)



To avoid severe burns, DO NOT attempt the next procedure when the engine is HOT. Wait for the engine, silencer and tailpipe to cool before proceeding.

#### NOTE

In general, all strip clamps that secure hoses and electrical cables must be removed. All disconnected hoses and open connections must be plugged.

- 1. Remove the engine hood, see 821 Engine hood, removal
- 2. Detach cable from the bracket.



- 3. Remove the grille and the front plate.



- 4. Remove the clamps from both sides of the cooler.




- 7. Connect a drain hose to the valve and place the drain hose down into a container. Open the valve and drain the coolant into the container.



- 8. Disconnect the radiator hoses and the lower hose (hidden).



- 9. Remove the screws from both sides and lift out the hydraulic oil cooler and the radiator.



1. Screw



- 11. Remove the fan.



1. Fan 12. Remove the attaching screws (4 attaching screws, 2 underneath). Remove the nuts and remove the silencer.



- 13. Loosen the hose clamp. Remove the screws and remove the air cleaner. Remove the screws (3 pcs) and remove the bracket.



- 14. Disconnect hose from the engine.



15. Disconnect the hoses (2 hoses, one hidden) from the engine and release the fuel filter/pump from the hydraulic tank.



16. Detach the seat , move the seat back, and lift up the rubber mat from the floor against the seat.  $1 \qquad \qquad 2$ 






19. Disconnect the hoses from the gearbox.



- 20. Disconnect the hoses from the gearbox.



- 21. Disconnect the hose from the gearbox.



- 22. Disconnect ground cables from the gearbox.



- 23. Turn off the electric power with the battery disconnect switch and disconnect the ground cable.



- 24. Disconnect the electrical cables from the starter motor.



- 26. Unscrew the nuts and remove the throttle control cable from the engine.



27. Disconnect the front propeller shaft from the gearbox unit.



1. Propeller shaft



29. Disconnect the connector from the working pump.



30. Remove the screws (2 screws) gearbox unit - working pump.



31. Arrange a strap around the working pump and tighten the string using a pinch-bar. Pull the working pump away from the gearbox.



- 32. Remove the attaching screws for the engine.



- 33. Remove the attaching screw from both sides of the gearbox.




# **Engine, removing**

Op nbr 210-070

885530 Rotation tool

Lifting chains, min. 1000 kg (2200 lb) two chain tensions



Hot liquids and machine parts can cause burns. Allow the machine to cool before beginning any work.



Always handle oils and other environmentally hazardous fluids in an environmentally safe manner.

#### NOTE

In general, all cable ties that secure hoses and electrical cables must be removed. All disconnected hoses and open connections must be plugged.

- 1. Place the machine in Service position 1, see 191 Service positions
- 2. Disconnect the main battery switch.
- 3. Remove the battery/batteries, see 310 Battery, changing.
- 4. Drain the coolant, see 173 Coolant, change.
- 5. Drain the transmission oil, see 173 Transmission, changing oil
- 6. Disassemble the engine hood, see <u>821 Engine hood, removal</u>.
- 7. Loosen the retaining clamp of the exhaust pipe (2). Remove the exhaust pipe together with it's sealing.




Figure 1 exhaust assembly, disassembly

- 8. Loosen and remove the retaining screws (1) of the oil filler neck assembly.
- 9. Loosen the retaining screws and disconnect the flexible exhaust tube from the turbocharger.

# 10. **WARNING**

The parts are heavy. Take appropriate safety cautions when handling them.

Use a slop to attach the exhaust assembly to a suitable lifting device.

- 11. Loosen and remove the retaining screws (3) of the exhaust assembly bracket.
- 12. Remove the exhaust assembly from the machine.
- 13. Loosen the retaining clamps (4, 5) from the upper radiator hose (1) and remove the hose.




Figure 2 radiator hose and air inlet, disassembly

- 14. Loosen the retaining clamp (3) from the air inlet (2) and remove it from the air filter assembly.
- 15. Loosen and remove the hoses (4, 5) connecting the expansion tank (3) with the coolant pump (6). **NOTE!**

Loosen the retaining clamps on the pump side, so the hoses can be removed with the tank.




Figure 3 radiator with attached parts
